Secretary's report: Motion to accept the minutes of the July 11, 2022 meeting as published in the August News Beacon was made by Doug KD8SST and seconded by Diane KD8SSX. Minutes were accepted with no corrections or changes.

Treasurer's report for June was read by Toby WT8OToby and included an acknowledgement of a recent donation to the club by John (K8JEK). Motion to approve: Dave KE8APO; Second: Ray K2RWO, approved.

Toby (WT8O) requested a moment of silence for Mike Eady KD8DZK, a long time member of the club and former president who is now a silent key.

President's report: * Jane K8JGR expressed shock and sorrow at the recent passing of Mike. There is currently no news or update on a memorial for Mike at this time. * There is a binder available on the table containing memorabilia of our Club's history dating back to 1932 and was saved by Les W8BID(SK). * Cuyahoga Falls Amateur Radio Club is hosting a Summit County parks on the air on September 14th. Jane has the email details which she will forward to Baji to share on our google group. * Discussion continued on different venue options for club meetings including Buehlers' River Styx and the Career Center. There are pros and cons to each as well as the security and AV restrictions at our current location at the senior center. * There are three email distribution lists for our club. The newsletter list is a "read only" and there are two google group lists (one general and one members only). The google lists need updating and Diane will provide Baji K8IIT with a current list of members for the update. * Our club is scheduled to have a display (with Fred K8FH's communications trailer) at the Heritage Farm Park on September 11th, which is the butterfly release event. * Gail KD8GGM and Fred's annual picnic is scheduled for September 18th.

Repeaters: The 6M transmit repeater is installed in Brunswick Hills and 6M is operational. Tower is only 40 ft, now so coverage will be less. Ed K8NVR is soliciting feedback on its performance. Dave N8JNX stated that he was able to reach it from Wellington. Tone is 107.2. * We are still working on the agreement with the new South Tower owner for 15year use in turn for the club paying for the painting (\$4K). Waiting for the owner sign off. * The new 220 MHz repeater is installed and operating. This is the trial burn-in period and Ed needs feedback on how this new repeater is working, since there were some initial bugs in the unit. Appears to be working fine after a week so far. It is 30 watts and has a threeminute time-out timer. * Ed will provide updated information on these repeaters so Jane can update the newsletter and web. * Kudos to Ed K8NVR, Ken K8TV, Fred K8FH, John K8JEK, Jane K8JGR and her son Kevin Reed for their recent work on these repeaters.

Programs: Toby WT80 is soliciting ideas for technical presentations. One is ham radio destinations in the area. The other is a follow up presentation on FT8.

Membership: Diane has hard copies of the member list available to pass out at the meeting. We welcome a new member: Tom WA8ICH

Motion to Adjourn: Made by Amy K2KSU and seconded by John K8JEK. The meeting was adjourned at 8:10pm.

Visualizing Everyone that has Ever Lived

How do you visualize every human that has ever lived in the last 2 million years?

Max Roser with Our World in Data had the idea to turn us all into grains of sand within an hourglass, and to equate the passing of people to the passing of time.

The Humanity Today and Humanity's Past infographic (next page) highlights a few key points in history and gives us a perspective of just how population growth has exploded over the last 2000 years.

Our past

Before we look ahead, let's look back. How many came before us? How many humans have ever lived?

It is not possible to answer this question precisely, but demographers Toshiko Kaneda and Carl Haub have tackled the question using the historical knowledge that we do have.

There isn't a particular moment in which humanity came into existence, as the transition from species to species is gradual. But if one wants to count all humans one has to make a decision about when the first humans lived. The two demographers used 200,000 years before today as this cutoff.¹

The demographers estimate that in these 200,000 years about 109 billion people have lived and died. $^{\rm 2}$

It is these 109 billion people we have to thank for the civilization that we live in. The languages we speak, the food we cook, the music we enjoy, the tools we use – what we know we learned from them. The houses we live in, the infrastructure we rely on, the grand achievements of architecture – much of what we see around us was built by them.

Our present

In 2022 7.95 billion of us are alive. Taken together with those who have died, about 117 billion humans have been born since the dawn of modern humankind. This means that those of us who are alive now represent about 6.8% of all people who ever lived.

These numbers are hard to grasp. I tried to bring it into a visualization to put them into perspective. $^{\rm 3}$

It's a giant hourglass. But instead of measuring the passage of time, it measures the passage of people.

Each grain of sand here represents 10 million people: each year 140 million babies are born. So we add 14 grains of sand to the hourglass. Every year, 60 million people die; this means 6 grains pass through the hourglass and are added to the large number of people who have died.⁴
