Case in point, the fledgling Digital Library of Amateur Radio & Communications is in peril due to a U.S. judge's ruling on March 24, declaring that that the online library operated by the nonprofit organization Internet Archive, infringed the copyrights of four major U.S. publishers by lending out digitally scanned copies of their books. My personal, biased, unwavering, opinion as a retired college professor, is that *any* book banning is wrong, since it interferes with education, the dissemination of knowledge, and informed discourse. Especially these days when knowledge appears to be in short supply and disinformation abounds.

But, when it comes to online, *controlled*, lending of books, it should be no different than physical book lending at your local library. Digital Library of Amateur Radio & Communications Surpasses 25,000 Items

In the six weeks since announcing that Internet Archive has begun gathering content for the Digital Library of Amateur Radio and Communications (DLARC), the project has quickly grown to more than 25,000 items, including ham radio newsletters, podcasts, videos, books, and catalogs. The project seeks additional contributions of material for the free online library.

You are welcome to explore the content currently in the library and watch the primary collection as it grows at https://archive.org/details/dlarc.

The new material includes historical and modern newsletters from diverse amateur radio groups including the National Radio Club (of Aurora, CO); the Telford & District Amateur Radio Society, based in the United Kingdom; the Malta Amateur Radio League; and the South African Radio League. The Tri-State Amateur Radio Society contributed more than 200 items of historical correspondence, newspaper clippings, ham festival flyers, and newsletters. Other publications include Selvamar Noticias, a multilingual digital ham radio magazine; and Florida Skip, an amateur radio newspaper published from 1957 through 1994. The library also includes the complete run of 73 Magazine — more than 500 issues — which are freely and openly available.

More than 300 radio related books are available in DLARC via controlled digital lending. These materials may be checked out by anyone with a free Internet Archive account for a period of one hour to two weeks. Radio and communications books donated to Internet Archive are scanned and added to the DLARC lending library.

Amateur radio podcasts and video channels are also among the first batch of material in the DLARC collection. These include Ham Nation, Foundations of Amateur Radio, the ICQ Amateur/Ham Radio Podcast, with many more to come. Providing a mirror and archive for "born digital" content such as video and podcasts is one of the core goals of DLARC.

Additions to DLARC also include presentations recorded at radio communications conferences, including GRCon, the GNU Radio Conference; and the QSO Today Virtual Ham Expo. A growing reference library of past radio product catalogs includes catalogs from Ham Radio Outlet and C. Crane.

DLARC is growing to be a massive online library of materials and collections related to amateur radio and early digital communications. It is funded by a significant grant from Amateur Radio Digital Communications (ARDC) to create a digital library that documents, preserves, and provides open access to the history of this community.



Treasurer's report for February was read by Treasurer, Toby WT8O. Motion to approve: Diane KD8SSX, Second: Fred K8FH. Approved.

President's Report: * Ed K8NVR reminded everyone to get their dues into Diane and also to submit articles to Jane K8JGR for the monthly newsletter. *Ed stated that 10m is very active right now in all modes and will be active for the next 4-6 weeks. It should be even better in the Fall. * Net controllers are still needed for our weekly Monday nets. Contact Ed or Baji K8IIT to select an open slot.

ARES: Bob K8MD reported that the annual ARES conference has been canceled for this year. He stated that he and a couple other ARES-Comm team members were activated for the Drag Queen event in Wadsworth. There were no communications issues, although Bob monitored radio activity and heard participants using DMR simplex on FRS frequencies. Bob stated that plans are in place to mount a 100ft tower in Chippewa on Heather Hedge Road. He also stated that a licensing session was held a week ago at the Everything Outdoor store at Pearl and Fenn. The owner is very supportive in offering his facility for this, and the plan going forward is to offer testing sessions monthly or quarterly.

Repeaters: There is a noise issue on the 440 repeater. Ed and Ken suspect antenna connection issues and will be investigating. The new clock module was received for the spare controller and it also runs fast. There is also an issue with DST not updating correctly on the main repeater. 220 repeater is working fine with no known issues.

Website: Jeff KE8UUF has been updating the club website and has gotten good feedback on it both at the meeting and in Facebook comments.

Annual Club Dinner: Thank you to Fred K8FH and Gail KD8GGM for organizing and hosting our annual dinner party. There were 43 attendees.

Thursday Night Training Sessions: Ed hosted radio training last Thursday covering FT8 and the FT991 Yaesu radio. He had 8 students attending. He will continue running this hands on training. Next session will be March 23 at 6 pm which will focus primarily on FT8. The following session will be on April 13 6 pm and will focus on the FT991.

Technical presentations: We need presenters for our technical sessions at future General-Meetings, or at least ideas so videos can be shown. * At the next meeting on April 10th there will be a Zoom meeting presentation by Walter Howard K5W8 on VARAC which is a free HF P2P real time chat application for amateur radio.

Hamvention: Toby WT8O stated that the CARS club will once again be running a bus to the Hamvention this year on May 20th. Price will be held at \$50 even though the cost of the bus has increased. Info will be on the CARS website or contact Toby for details or reservations

Meeting Adjourned: Meeting was adjourned at 7:30 pm and was followed by two videos. One was on HF propagation in general. The second video was on solar flares and the Carrington effect.

April 18th World Amateur Radio Day

What: 2023 World Amateur Radio Day Who: All amateur radio operators worldwide

When: Tuesday, April 18, 2023 at 0000 UTC until Wednesday, April 19, 2023 at 0000 UTC Where: A global event covering all regions of the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) Why: World Amateur Radio Day, held on April 18 each year, is celebrated worldwide by radio amateurs and their national associations which are organized as member-societies of the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU). It was on this day in 1925 that the IARU was formed in Paris.

American Radio Relay League (ARRL) Co-Founder Hiram Percy Maxim was its first president. Amateur radio experimenters were the first to discover that the short-wave spectrum could support long-distance radio signal propagation. In the rush to use these shorter wavelengths, amateur radio was "in grave danger of being pushed aside," the IARU's history has noted. Amateur Radio pioneers met in Paris in 1925 and created the IARU to promote the interests of amateur radio worldwide and to protect and enhance its spectrum privileges. Today, the IARU is a federation consisting of more than 160 national amateur radio organizations in as many countries and separate territories. The International Secretariat of the IARU is ARRL The National Association for Amateur Radio® in the United States.

On World Amateur Radio Day, all radio amateurs are invited to take to the airwaves to enjoy our global friendship with other amateurs, and to show our skills and capabilities to the public.


How: World Amateur Radio Day is not a contest but rather an opportunity to "talk" about the value of amateur radio to the public and our fellow amateur colleagues. It is also a great opportunity to talk about your radio club and amateur radio in local media as a lead-up to ARRL Field Day (held each year during the fourth full weekend in June) and another ham radio related activity in your community – such as volunteers who serve in local emergency communication readiness including the ARRL Amateur Radio Emergency Service®.

Here are just a few ways to participate in, and promote, World Amateur Radio Day:

- Get a station on the air! Create your own personal "event" to talk about amateur radio to others, including family and friends.
- Find out more about World Amateur Radio Day by checking the IARU website and other Resources listed below.
- Create and hold a special net or on-air event on World Amateur Radio Day to raise the level
 of attention for the celebration, and to encourage other hams to talk about our hobby. Consider creating and offering a commemorative certificate for contacting your special activation. It can be an electronic one as these are cost effective.
- Get the word out! If you are an ARRL Public Information Coordinator, Public Information
 Officer, or responsible for radio club publicity, send a press release and conduct some public
 relations outreach to highlight the day and/or events. Talk about all of the activities radio
 amateurs have continued to support during the pandemic, and how amateur radio serves

- Promote your personal World Amateur Radio Day activity(ies) on social media platforms like
 Twitter and Facebook by using the hashtag #WorldAmateurRadioDay. Make sure you send it
